My cat and I were in Miami in early July so now both of us are under the gun to get a short article into the August newsletter.

Here is the latest (and saddest) position regarding our finances in June. We took in \$14,140.90 in revenues and paid out \$14,417.25 in expenses. That gave the Post a loss of \$276.35. If it had not been for donations from Capt Ski's Golf Tournament and the Auxiliary donations, the Post would have lost over \$3,000.00.

The cat knows what happened. That's why she went to Miami to get over her depression. Lounge sales were way down. We need to have \$10,000 in sales just to begin to break even. In June we had only \$8,716. Our meal sales were also way down, and we need to make at least \$3,000 monthly to break even there. And of course our expenses were always around \$14,000 monthly. In short, we did not get much business in June, and we suffered accordingly. It was special events and donations that minimized our loss position.

We have some very significant financial challenges coming up very soon. I and my cat will discuss them in our next newsletter.

Remember our fallen soldiers in your prayers and our wounded. We will win this war despite what the other side thinks.


