The dealers are knowledgeable and friendly and from what I have seen the players are having a good time. We are offering food on Poker night so come out and join the fun. As our mailing list and the postal rates both continue to grow, this is an important issue. Additionally, whether we like it or not, we are living in an electronic age. Many organizations now do the bulk of their communications by e-mail. I'm fresh out of good news (you knew this was coming didn't you?) We are now in the final stage of our cost analysis of the Post food and beverage service. Please understand that a great deal of research, thought and discussion has gone into this as well as input from a couple of our members who are in the commercial food and beverage industry. The bottom line is that within the next week or so you will notice a slight increase in bar prices. Most will be in the quarter (.25) range. Some premium call brands will increase slightly higher than that. Price increases are never popular, however as you have no doubt noticed in your own daily shopping, the cost of goods and services have risen everywhere. ~~The Post is not immune~~ from the increase from our suppliers and we continue to be plagued by repair cost from our aging appliances. In the big picture, the increases are nominal but combined with some cost cutting measures we have put in place; they will help our bottom line considerably.

I really hate to beat a dead horse and this one has most certainly been beat to death, but the easiest and best way you can help keep the Post solvent and operating like the finely tuned machine we strive to be, is your patronage. It really doesn't matter how hard we try to keep the expenses down and the price increases at bay if business at the bar and attendance on meal nights and at various special events remains low. There are currently 629 people on the mailing list. (Legion, Auxiliary, and S.A.L. combined). That number is astounding when you consider that we only see about 10% of them on a regular basis and are forever begging for volunteers to cook Sunday breakfast, weekly lunches, etc. Where in the world are that many people hiding and what's the weather like there?

Every month I have advertised my e-mail address ([dianebeason@comcast.net](mailto:dianebeason@comcast.net)), and asked for your comments or suggestions on how we could serve you better or entice you into the Post more often. To date, I have never received the first e-mail so I have to assume we're doing everything right. If I'm wrong about that, let me know and my tireless dedicated staff and I will make every effort we can to make it right and win you over.

Finally, our prayers and sincere condolences go out to Commander Jim Ross and his family on the loss of his father. Mr. Ross Sr. was a 94-year-old man and although he was a resident of Pennsylvania, he was a member of Post #233.

## FINANCE OFFICER

Oh, good gosh! The Finance Officer has written another article, and he rarely publishes. Well, what does he have to say this time? Read on.

First, a few comments are in order regarding our financial report for January 2008. In short, we didn't do very well. In gross revenue our post took in \$15,573.00. Hey, Hutch, that doesn't sound bad. However, and here comes the down side, our expenses for the month amounted to \$17,853.24. That gave us a net revenue flow of..... well, you do the math and see what figure you get. (Hint: when my cat and I did it, we came up with a figure that said we lost around \$2,280.00).

What made January 08 bad, you may be wondering? Well, business was down when compared to December 07. In December, the canteen sold over \$9,337 in Christmas cheer compared to \$8,907 in January. On the other hand, and this is indeed interesting, we sold over \$4,302 in meals (steak night, Wednesday nights breakfast and lunches) during January and only \$3,219 in December. Now, this brings up a paradox. If the canteen sales were down and our meal sales for January were up, what went wrong to make us look so bad for January overall? In looking over the list of individual expenses for January, my cat saw it in about three seconds, and it was a subject near and dear to her heart. I won't tell you what she saw, but I shall give you a hint. And the hint is..... food, food, and more food. Want details? Review January's financial report next time you come to visit Post #233. In February's newsletter I identified those individuals who have copies of the detailed financial report.

Don't despair too much just yet. Even though the accounting period for February 08 is still open, it looks like we are doing fairly well. I am in the process of doing an intern report before I leave for Miami, and I should have a good idea of where we stand for February. I know the Valentine Dinner put on by Charles Kees and so many others really helped. If you didn't come or didn't reserve early.... Well, you have no one to blame but yourself. We'll be talking about this evening for months.

I never promised you a rose garden (that was a hit song in my younger days, but I don't know the singer), but I did promise you a brief article on the pull-tab operations known as Instant Bingo. There is a law governing how the American Legion may operate this game of chance (i.e. euphemism for gambling). This game is governed by the Evelyn Wiesman-Price Act, more simply known as Florida SB 500. Rather than read the entire law to you, I will summarize:

1. Veteran organization may operate such a program provided that we buy pull tab tickets from State approved vendors. (We do that)

2. The law requires that at least 65% of the revenue generated from the sales of those tickets be paid back in prizes. (Hey, that is pretty good odds in favor of those who want to gamble on this game. Oops, I should have used the euphemism "chance" in lieu of "gambling"). The remaining 35% is to be used in expenses to operate the Instant Bingo Program and the veteran organizations. Now hear this. **UNDER no circumstances will the post proceeds be used to pay salaries, expenses such as electricity, food, alcohol, repairs, etc., for the individual Post.** So if you think that Instant Bingo is a "slush fund" to be used for day-to-day operation, forget it!

An example will help clarify or confuse the above point. Post 3.14159... (that is the value of Pi, a constant whose absolute exact value cannot be determined; therefore, we shall never really be absolutely certain who Post 3.14159... is, and their post judge advocate likes it that way) buys 4,000 tickets (called a DEAL by SB500) that are sold to you for \$1.00 each. Post Pi pays the State approved supplier \$.03 per ticket for a total expense of \$120.00. Post Pi now sells to its member's 4,000 tickets that bring in \$4,000. Since 65% is paid out to the gamblers, \$2,600 would be paid to the individuals who play the game of chance (65% of \$4,000). The post would get the remaining \$1,400 (35% of \$4,000). The Post's net proceeds from that deal would be \$1,280 (\$1400 - \$120 = \$1280). That money may be used to donations veteran activities or expenses associated to operating the Instant Bingo Program. Enough said about Instant Bingo in this article.

As with the last article I wrote, my cat has come and is reminding me that it is time for an early evening drink. Mindful of my cat's wishes, I close my article by saying:

Fully support and give prayers to our combat troops fighting in Afghanistan and Iraqi. May God and their leaders guide them well.

Fully support and give prayers to our wounded soldiers recovering in military and VA hospitals so that the soldiers and their families may find comfort and hope.

And never, never forget to honor and remember our fallen heroes who gave the ultimate sacrifice to gain and preserve the freedom of the United States of America.
