Did you know- The American Legion was born at a caucus of the American Expeditionary Force (AEF) in Paris, France from a proposal by Lt. Col. Theodore Roosevelt Jr. to a group of representatives of AEF divisions and service units. This occurred in March 1919. A subsequent organizational caucus was held in St. Louis, MO in May 1919. The preamble to the constitution was put into form by some 1,100 delegates and the blueprint for The American Legion was born. On September 16, 1919 the Congress of the United States chartered The American Legion giving official sanction to the constitution adopted in St. Louis.

This month on September 14<sup>th</sup>, Post 233 will hold its second annual Law & Order Awards Ceremony for Law Enforcement Officer and Firefighter of the Year 2013. A great meal by Cap'n Ski's Original Fish Fry Team will be offered for \$10.00, along with entertainment by the Beach Street Boogie. Summer is just about over and the fall and holiday season is upon us, the year is just flying by. I am sure we are all looking forward to the fundraising events that will be going on in the next few months. There has been much discussion and worry about the IRS audit guidelines that has been circulating recently, talk about Lois Lerner targeting the American Legions and their tax exempt status. First Lois Lerner has been suspended from the IRS and the guidelines have been around for decades. The one that is circulating is the latest updated version to inform agents of the revised modifications concerning ancestors and lineal descendents as provided by the Military Relief Act of 2003 passed by Congress. These guidelines cover not only 501(c)(19) tax exempt entities, the American Legions, but other tax exempt organizations as well. I do not believe the Legions are being targeted but we await further clarification from National.

In the mean time, to protect the tax exempt status of Post 233, I am making the changes necessary in the financial reporting of the post to ensure that the post is in compliance with all State and Federal regulations. Many of the changes are minor but are necessary to protect the tax exempt status of the post and the membership. Most of the changes affect the employees of the post and how they are to perform their job duties and most will go unnoticed by the members. The patience and understanding of the membership would be appreciated as our employees work to ensure our full compliance with the State and Federal rules and regulations. I will continue to monitor the situation and update the membership as new information is brought to my attention.
